

# Wallace - Malagash & Area

Located on the Sunrise Trail (Route 6) between Pugwash and Tatamagouche are the beautiful communities of Wallace and Malagash. Wallace is a picturesque seaside village depending primarily on fishing, farming, and tourism. It has a public wharf with launching ramp available for **pleasure boats**. Each morning and evening visitors and locals can be seen on the wharf enjoying and photographing the **incredible sunrises and sunsets**. Wallace was famous for its sandstone quarry with many buildings in Canada and the United States, including the Parliament buildings in Ottawa, being made from Wallace Sandstone.

The newly expanded **Wallace and Area Museum** was the former home of a 19th century shipbuilder, and is a growing attraction in the area. Showcasing numerous historic artifacts and sharing the stories of the native

Mi'kmaq, Acadian, and Loyalist settlers, the museum also features local **art exhibits, walking trails, and heritage gardens**.

Not far from the museum is the **Wallace Bay Wildlife Trail** – a wonderful location for **birding**. The trail is a great place to observe shore birds, various aquatic and migratory birds, as well as many small mammals.

In nearby Fox Harbour visitors may **golf** at an exclusive seaside **Golf Resort and Spa**. Or visit the **Fox Harbour Provincial Park** for a picnic, stroll along the beach, or for a dip in the warm salt water. Another nearby beach to enjoy is the **Malagash Blue Sea Corner Beach Park** in the neighboring community of Malagash.

Malagash is a quiet rural area home to a wonderful vineyard overlooking the Northumberland Strait. Located in an idyllic setting, **Jost Vineyards** has earned a reputation for producing world class wines, and for winning numerous prestigious international awards. With a wine store, self-serve deli, outdoor terrace and gift shop, Jost also offers **Vineyard Tours** (in season) and hosts numerous events throughout the year.

Malagash also has a unique history, which is shared at the local **Malagash Museum**. Malagash was the first rock salt mine in Canada, providing a major source of employment for the area between 1918-1959. Much of the museum's focus is on the salt industry, past and present, featuring displays, written material and artifacts about the mine, and other natural and social history of the area.
