Four seasons of adventure awaits in the wonderful Wentworth Valley. By taking exits 7 or 11 off Trans Canada Highway 104 avoid the expense of a toll and experience the incredible scenic beauty of the Cobequid Hills. Located on Trunk 4, Wentworth offers year round outdoor recreation opportunities.

Wentworth Provincial Park is a great place to picnic or spend the day. Nearby are several lowland and mountainside **trails** to explore, including those of the Wentworth Hostel. Whether **hiking** or **mountain biking**, local trails offer many rewarding challenges. Wentworth is one of the most spectacular places in Nova Scotia to view and photograph fall colors.

The valley embraces its visitors with a panorama of reds, oranges, and gold as the autumn leaves begin to change. With plenty of surrounding wilderness,

Wentworth is also a great location for **hunting, fishing**, or for simply **observing wildlife**. To spot a soaring bald eagle is not uncommon in this area.

The community celebrates a **Fall Colours Festival** every year on Thanksgiving weekend in October, where visitors may have the opportunity to ride a ski lift to the top of the mountain to reveal the most incredible view.

Wentworth is most well known for winter as it is home to the largest ski hill in Nova Scotia. With the highest vertical in the Province and the most ski-able terrain in the Maritimes, **Ski Wentworth** offers great skiing, snowboarding, snow tubing, and a place to warm up.

Another winter past time is **snowmobiling**. The local snowmobile club grooms over 170kms of trail and invites visiting snowmobilers who wish to purchase a trail pass to explore this wonderful terrain.
